- Formed 1981 Allan & Beryl Strom and others
- Meetings in Maitland Bay Centre
- Aim to keep an eye on environment
- Succession of new committee members over last 10 years
- Maitland Bay Centre run by volunteers open every weekend about 5,000 visitor each year
- Varied attendance at meetings a lot of people when there are big issues eg. Developments, aerial spray
- Held a Climate Change Forum in February at Killcare over 120 attended
- Follow up meeting solar, community garden main focus is on Climate Change

Hosted a community consultation meeting – about 50 people attended

 World Style Café – 7 tables that people could move around and
 discuss topics

Concerns:

- Communication with Council lost work ethic, lost knowledge too big and unwieldy to manage
- Local Environment Plan and Deferred matters

Q: What is Council's position on offshore seismic testing – reported that this had ceased but understanding is that this is only for whale migration season

- ~ 300 members
- Community meeting once / month and guest speakers
- Primary focus advocacy eg. LEP / DCP
- Operate Wagstaff Hall and tennis court Hall built by community on Council land – group does a lot of maintenance
- Worked with other groups to develop community resilience plan what resources we have to assist community

Infrastructure matters that we would like Council to address

- Foreshore
- Parking and road alignment
- Road sealing Albert St South and drainage
- Parkland improvements at Pretty Beach also along front of Hardys Bay
- Garbage services a couple of streets not collected under impression that Council was going to engage a smaller truck for difficult areas
- Public Transport improvement eg. On demand service more frequent bus services – also ferry to Woy Woy

1. Operational Plan 2020 / 2021

- Currently on exhibition was due to close this week however Council will be extending exhibition period
- Noted that NSW Government last week announced that councils will have until 1 August,
 2020 to adopt their operational plan (currently meant to be adopted by end of June)
- Noted that the COVID-19 will have a significant impact on Council's budget and financial position – expect that there will need to be changes to draft Operational Plan

2. Strategic Planning

- Council resolved (9 March 2020) to defer adoption of draft Consolidated LEP / DCP until after Local Strategic Planning Statement has been finalised.
- Council also previously resolved to take a Ward based approach to the LSPS staff
 interpreted this to mean consultation on a ward basis and the draft that came to Council
 was a region wide LSPS. Council (23 March) resolved to include an additional Chapters for
 each Ward that includes a map of the Ward and outlines proposed Land Use for that Ward,
 the planning priorities and actions as they apply to that particular Ward
- Council also resolved to write to the Minister for Planning requesting a 12 month extension for the adoption of the LSPS based upon the current enforced restrictions relating to the COVID 19 Pandemic to allow Council to undertake appropriate community consultation

3. Planning and COVID-19

Some key points:

- Planning System Acceleration Program Dept of Planning "We're cutting red tape and simplifying the planning system to fast-track planning projects and allow for new construction jobs and construction work to continue where possible". Not clear what this means yet
- Councils no longer required to advertise DAs and notices in newspapers can do this on website. This is a permanent change
- The <u>COVID-19 Legislation Amendment (Emergency Measures) Bill 2020</u> removed the requirement for planning decision makers (such as councils) to display physical copies of some documents. Department of Planning, Industry and Environment has also approved the use of local council and state agency websites to display these documents. Councils do not need to provide physical copies at their offices. Digital documents include development applications, Environmental Impact Statements on exhibition, registers of development consents, complying development certificates and construction certificates.

6. **Dredging**

 Request for update on dredging along Brisbane Water – and future plan to maintain the channel – request for analysis / engineering re. Ettalong Channel

7. MacMasters Beach

• Shark nets – acknowledgement that they are not effective.
